The Honey Bee's natural habitat:

There are only 7 recognized species of honey bee out of 20,000 different bee species found worldwide. The honey bees build and inhabit a hive, run by their female queen honey bee who populates the hive. The honey bee is an herbivorous animal therefore lives purely on the nutrients from plants. Honey bees prefer to ingest the sweeter plant produce such as nectar, pollen and fruits.

Its Food: The honey bee collects nectar from flowers which it takes back to the hive to be turned into honey.
