The Primary 'Stages'

Your child's time at Primary School is

divided into three Key Stages:

Foundation Stage (FS)

Primary 1-2

Ages 4 – 6

Key Stage One (KSI)

Primary 3 - 4

Ages 6 – 8

Key Stage Two (KSII)

Primary 5, 6 & 7

Ages 8 - 11

The Foundation Stage

Children will go into the Foundation Stage when they start Primary School in September. This stage covers their first two years. Your children will experience well-planned and challenging play that builds upon their interests and curiosity. Teachers will encourage them to explore their feelings and emotions and how to work with others. These are basic skills that your child will need throughout their life!

Skills

The vital and life-long skills of:

Talking and Listening, Reading, Writing and Using Mathematics



are, as always at the heart of the Foundation Stage. Your child will be taught these skills every day in an active and enjoyable way.



Cross-Curricular Skills such as Using ICT and Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities pervade all work.

Subjects

There are many familiar faces to the Curriculum, and the children still learn the key subjects, such as Maths and Science!

Subjects are grouped together into Areas of Learning, which are:

Mathematics & Numeracy
Language & Literacy
The World Around Us
The Arts
Personal Development & Mutual Understanding
Physical Development / Education

Reading

A lot of time will be spent at the beginning of the year preparing your children for Reading.

- Do not expect your child to bring home an individual reading book for the first term.
- •Children will be taught reading strategies: modelled and shared reading activities during the school day.
- •Initially when your child receives a book it will be wordless.
- Only high frequency words will be taught.
- Your child will be encouraged to use other reading strategies.
- •When they begin to receive reading books they will be from a variety of genre and schemes.

Writing

- •Children will write at different stages. Not all children will come to school in September 'ready' to write.
- •Children need to be ready to make shapes and draw simple pictures before they can write. All our activities with Lego, Playdough, threading beads, cutting etc will strengthen little fingers and help prepare for them for writing.
- •The teacher will introduce letter formation which will be taught in school.

The School Day

Our school day is divided as follows:

8.45 am

The school gate is opened

9,00 am

Classroom lessons begin

10.40 - 10.55 am

Break time and supervised outdoor play

10.55 – 12.35 pm

Classroom lessons continue

12.35 – 1.00 pm

Packed Lunch (In the Classrooms)

1.00 – 1.30 pm

Supervised outdoor play

1.30 - 2.00 pm

Afternoon lessons continue

2.00 pm

Break at 10.30 am

- •The mid morning Break is a very important time in your child's day as it allows time for them to 'refresh' themselves by eating and socialising in the classroom and playing outdoors with their peers. Children who choose to take School Milk will drink it at this time or alternatively use their desk top water bottle which goes home daily to be washed.
- •This is a snack, provided by the school at a small cost consisting of fruit and yoghurt which will vary throughout the Term.

Lunch at 12.35 pm

- •The Lunch break will consist of a packed lunch provided by the parent / guardian
- The Lunch box should be clearly labelled
- School promotes a Healthy Lunch
- Children will play outdoors for 30 mins before their return to class at 1.30 pm
- •Children will be escorted down the path at 2 pm sharp ... (Be aware that staff teach KSII in the afternoon).

Homework

Homework will be very **practical** in nature and should always be completed by the child.

eg Bring in 4 small items from home.

Encourage your child to count out and find these items for themselves. Your child will have a Home Learning folder that will be used to hold their Homework activities.

eg sounds, high-frequency words etc.

PE

Physical Education takes place on Tuesday and Friday for Primary One children.

Children will wear their school regulation tracksuits on these days. They will be asked to change into plimsolls themselves so it is VERY important that the shoes they have are named and have VELCRO fastenings. Please purchase the small school boot bags available in September.

Please ensure all items of clothing are labelled.

Reporting



There will be two verbal consultations and one written:

Requests from teacher



DO:

- Send all money into school for trips etc enclosed in the school envelope system,
- Contact the class teacher if you're concerned regarding your child's progress,
- Understand that your child may not talk about their school day and its routines in much detail.
