Term Three has proven to be another incredibly busy period. Children have been engaged in their class work and I have been delighted to see the start of the after school activities for children in Primary 5 – 7. Class Tests have also take place this term for children in P4 – P7. Thank you for your support from home as you continue to support and prepare children for their assessments. We have been delighted to have had a full year of teaching and learning without lockdowns. This period has been very taxing for staff who have operated a bubble within their classes to reduce mixing. However, it has meant an increased amount of contact / teaching time; free from interruptions or the usual 'normal' routines such as assembly, trips, play rehearsals etc; which make up so much of normal school life. This contact / teaching time will of course have helped with our catch-up programme for all children. It must also be said that we are delighted to see so many of the school enrichments re-commence such as visits into the community, extra-curricular activities, end of year class trips and now P7 look towards their residential to Shannaghmore.

HM Queen's Jubilee Celebrations

We are busily preparing in school for our own special celebrations to mark the magnificent Platinum Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II. The Performing Arts Jubilee Club are preparing an Assembly which they hope to offer to the school in Key Stages.

The school will provide a snack break to all children (including those with special dietary requirements) on Tuesday 31 May so morning break will not be required from home. The School Kitchen is providing a special menu for the day which is attached to this Newsletter. We trust the weather will be good as we plan to eat outside in Street Party style. If the weather is inclement we will still have our street party in the Dining Hall! In the afternoon children will enjoy a movie afternoon within their respective classrooms and be given an iced-lolly.



Uniform

Tuesday 14 June.



Football Boots / Carrick Foundation

Orchard Events are delighted to have teamed up with Michael Carrick Foundation to support their campaign, Carrick's Boot Room. Launched back in 2018, the campaign was created in a bid to ensure children, no matter their background or ability, have access to the equipment they need to be able to take part in sport and be the best that they can be. However, this is the first campaign within Northern Ireland.



During the last Boot Room campaign, more than one thousand pairs of boots were distributed to children who had incorrect or ill-fitting footwear. These donations not only enable children and young people to play safely but allow them to become part of a team, attend sessions in safe spaces and find new friends.

We're calling upon people to find their unwanted or outgrown football boots and astro trainers and donate them to us through your school. Boots must be in a wearable condition. Every pair of donated boots will be thoroughly checked, cleaned and re-laced, ready to be distributed to those who need them most.

Our aim is to collect your boots, distribute as many as possible locally in Northern Ireland, with surplus being sent directly to Michael Carrick Foundation. Within your club, you will have the option to both collect boots to be redistributed or to avail of 'new to you' boots for children and young people who are in need. Fitting sessions will also be arranged before the start of next season. A collection bin is in the central mall of school for any boots which will then be picked up at a convenient time by the charity. Thank you for your help!

Habitat for Humanity

We were delighted to have Peter Graham from Habitat for Humanity conduct workshops with all of our Key Stage Two pupils. They learnt about the third world and the importance of recycling. The children were shocked by how long it takes some of our waste to disintegrate! Pete gave us lots of ideas about how to reuse and repurpose some items that would normally get thrown away.

Windsor Hill Pedestrian Gate

The Windsor Hill gate still remains a cause for concern!

The school receives regular phone calls from the residents of Windsor Hill complaining that children are being 'dropped off' by parents who do not live in the development. May I respectfully remind you that there is no such facility in the development for 'drop offs' and that the safety of our children is ALWAYS our paramount concern. Cars stopping at a pedestrian path are a dangerous hazard! PSNI are monitoring the situation.



We are VERY concerned that a child will be injured at this access point. PLEASE STOP!

I wish to draw your attention to the response from The Education Authority regarding this pedestrian entrance:

Neither the Education Authority nor Waringstown Primary School have any responsibility for traffic management beyond the school boundary and are therefore unable to take measures to control how members of the public park their vehicles on the public highway. Officials in the Department for Infrastructure or Transport NI may be able to advise you further.
