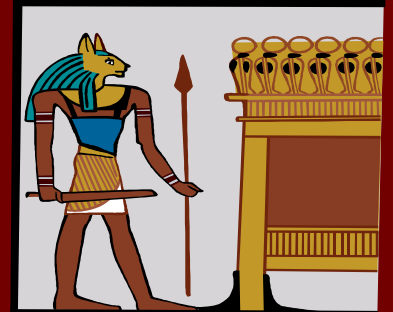
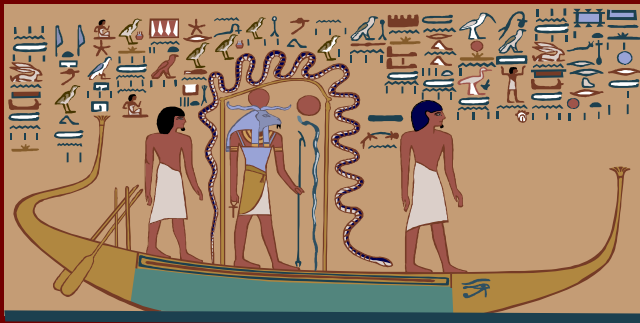
OUR RESEARCH

COPTIC CHRISTIANITY TRIUMPHED AND THE LAST GREAT SYMBOL OF THE OLD GODS, THE TEMPLE OF ISIS AT PHILÆ WAS CLOSED IN 551 AD. THE ARRIVAL OF ISLAM IN THE 600S COMPLETED THE TRANSFORMATION.
